

The Elaine D. Rodrigues Scout of the Year Award

The Elaine D. Rodrigues Scout of the Year Award is presented annually to a scout that the troop leadership recognizes as going the extra mile for the troop. There are no specific tasks that the boy must do, just that he must do what he does well and beyond normal expectations. It is up to the Assistant Scoutmasters or other registered adults to supply the Scoutmaster with a candidates name prior to the Winter Court of Honor. Once done, the troop leaders will discuss the candidate and determine who should receive the award. It is possible that in any given year no scout will stand out as deserving the award.

In addition to having their names added to the plaque the Scout of the Year also receives a certificate and wilderness survival book.

The Elaine D. Rodrigues Scout of the Year Award was named after a volunteer for Troop 61 who started as a “Cub” mom and then continued on into Boy Scouts helping the troop out in anyway that was needed. At the time of her passing Elaine was the Troop Treasure. In 2004 when Troop 1607 was created the Elaine D. Rodrigues Scout of the Year award came with the leaders to the new troop so that her work could continue to be honored by those who knew her.
