

The Volunteer Chair

The Volunteer Chair is a camp chair presented by the Troop Committee or Scoutmaster as a form of recognition and thanks to adults that have assisted in running the troop. The chair is recognized as a symbol for the leader to sit down, relax, catch your breath; you've done a great job. There is no direct rule of thumb as to when to present a chair though it is normally done for the following occasions: when an active leader retires from the troop or when an active leader takes a key role in the troop.
